Cherylann Lambert Walsh began Project Just Because from her home in 1998. As a native to the MetroWest area she saw basic family needs being unfulfilled and opened her heart to them, thus starting the founding phrase "a Mom in her basement."

Even with 4 young children of her own, she initiated and implemented programs to help those less fortunate in her community. Project Just Because has expanded since then and now serves over 10,000 people every year. A testament to Cherylann's tremendous hard work and dedication to something she believes in.

Project Just Because is dedicated to helping people within an environment of dignity, care and confidentiality. It is their goal to be a resource for individuals and families in need while creating an element of hope for a brighter tomorrow. Another key goal is to create educational and community service opportunities for people who want to help people in need.

The Project Just Because facility is a community service center that provides an opportunity for thousands of community service volunteers each year to help with the 18 special programs they provide. In addition local communities tour the site to see firsthand how volunteers can get directly involved in helping others.

Cherylann's extraordinary dedicated service has been recognized by the State House of Representatives and State Senate and she is one of the Governor's Project of Light Award recipients. Cherylann has also received the distinguished Unsung Heroine Award by the Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women.

The entire MetroWest area is truly fortunate to have Cherylann working in our community and providing these much needed services for our neighbors.

Letter from 2009 Hopkinton Good Scout Award Committee

As is the case in all communities, there are always those who work diligently, seeking to advance the important work of the town. They are the leaders—the ones who make decisions, roll up their sleeves, and get things done.

Cherylann Lambert Walsh and David Stoldt are two of these people. They have tirelessly championed and supported countless Hopkinton projects, some that they initiated themselves.

It is for this reason that the Knox Trail Council, Boy Scouts of America, has chosen to honor Cherylann and David as the recipients of the Hopkinton Good Scout Award for 2009. To show your support for these worthy individuals and to help us celebrate all that they have achieved, we would greatly appreciate your attendance at a get-together at the Hopkinton Country Club.

At the same time, your support will provide crucial funds for the continued growth of Scouting. Proceeds from this important community event will provide services to youth, such as camping programs, scholarships, leadership training and program materials.

An active public sector volunteer, Dave has served on the Hopkinton School Committee, the Hopkinton Athletic Association, the Hopkinton Land Use Study Committee, the Fruit Street Development Committee, the Elementary School Site Selection and Building Committees and the Marathon Fund Committee.

Dave serves in various charitable capacities including co-chair of the Phillips Academy annual Parent Fund and he provided a challenge gift for a student center expansion for the Civil and Environmental Engineering department of the University of Illinois. In 2000 Dave spearheaded an effort to encourage alumni to endow the Fighting Illini men's gymnastics program. The endowment is now funded at \$500,000 and provides scholarships for student-athletes.

While in college, Dave was a gymnast, earning an NCAA championship, two Big Ten titles, a Big Ten Medal of Honor and was honored in 2005 by the NCAA with a Silver Anniversary Award.

More recently, Dave was President of Nascent BioSciences, a life sciences company he co-founded and he is currently Principal of Commonwealth Pacific Ventures which invests in early-stage companies. His career has spanned the private and public sector, including careers at an electric utility company, an investment banking firm and helping to create jobs and products by mentoring early-stage companies.

Dave was born and raised in Hinsdale, Illinois and in 2008 was inducted into the Hinsdale High School Hall of Fame. He graduated from the University of Illinois, and later earned an MBA at Stanford. Dave and his wife Connie moved to Hopkinton with their three children, Conner, Emerson, and Camerin eleven years ago.

Both Dave and his brother were Boy Scouts, where two of his fondest memories are a 110-mile hike from the Ohio River to the Mississippi River and snow camping in Wisconsin. As Dave recalls, "Some of life's best lessons come from Scouting."
